## Synchronization Today



- Devices not (fully) supported
- No desktop independent solution
- No "out-of-box" solution
- No Open Source solutions by manufactures



#### What is OpenSync?



- Synchronization Framework
- Plugin based
- Platform Independent
- Lesser GNU Public License (LGPL)
- Started by Armin Bauer in 2005
- Successor of MultiSync (GTK only)

- Comparing Changes
- Conflict Handling
- Object Type Handling
  - Contacts
  - Events
  - Notes
  - Data
  - ...
- ...
- Merge and Capabilities (>= OpenSync 0.30)

- •SyncML 1.0 / 1.1 (and 1.2)


- Based on libsyncml

- Member = Configuration + Plugin













#### **Problem: Different Environments**



Only latest changes got synchronized!






